Such was the case in Paul's letter to the Philippians, where he had to plead with Euodia and Syntyche to "be of the same mind" (Philippians 4 v 2). Their personal friction created a roadblock to their spiritual service, and their "tug-of-war" was harming the life of the church.

Paul's appeal was for them to pull together and work for the honour of the Master. It is an appeal that serves us well. When we feel distanced from our fellow believers, we must look for the common ground we have in the Saviour.



Church is no place for a tug-of-war. It's imperative that we work together for the advancement of God's kingdom. He can use us in wonderful ways when we lay aside our personal differences and pull together on the rope.
